These children do not benefit from government funded support. The program is aimed at achieving measurable, sustainable change and involves providing schools with trained volunteers from the community to help children weekly for 15 weeks (Reading for Life) or 10 weeks (Counting for Life) to improve the children's literacy and numeracy skills and enhance their self-esteem and confidence.
